The Bills We Have Chosen to Cover in the 2015 Session Voting Record

We have chosen to cover the bills listed on our voting record based on the following factors:

1. The bills covered are all bills upon which all organizational members of the Montana Public Education Center took the same position; and
2. The bills impact, positively or negatively, one or more of the tenets reflected in The Great Work of Montana's Public Schools, our joint publication reflecting the priorities of our groups.

Our 2015 Legislative Session Voting Record

As we reflect on the 2015 Legislative Session, there is much for which we are thankful, but also several areas of concern in the perspective held by some legislators serving in the 2015 Session. We have prepared a voting record for both the House and Senate to give our members and the public insight regarding how elected representatives and senators have voted on issues affecting the community ownership and success of our public schools.

Our goal in putting this record out is to provide our members and the public with an opportunity to open a dialogue and discuss these votes with their elected legislators – to affirm and support those supporting our public schools and hopefully change the minds of those who are currently voting in a manner that has harmed the interests of the children in our public schools before they vote on such issues during the upcoming interim and/or future sessions of the Montana Legislature.

The Calculation of Legislators' Ratings:

The percentage attributed to each legislator represents the percentage of "correct" votes of the total votes cast on the bills we have incorporated into the record. Specific standards and criteria are as follows:

1. We default to a 3rd reading vote whenever available as the official vote on any given bill.
2. When a 3rd reading vote has not been taken, we default to the last vote taken. This occurs in situations, for example, where a bill fails on 2nd reading or when a bill is passed on 2nd reading and then re-referred to House Appropriations or Senate Finance and Claims.
3. Votes identified as "right" (which are designated with an "R") consist of votes cast as suggested by the unanimous testimony and/or lobbying of each of our groups, which in turn are based on resolutions and other position statements taken by each of our membership groups and our collective position in support or opposition. The votes we have identified as "right" also align with the perspective of Montana Voters as documented in the public opinion poll commissioned by the Montana Public Education Center, which was conducted by Zogby Analytics in September 2014.
4. Votes identified as "wrong" (which are designated with a "W") consist of votes cast against the unanimous position of our groups.
5. An unexcused absence on a particular vote is categorized as "wrong" as the legislator is either present but not voting in such instances, or has failed to secure an excuse from the Legislator for his or her absence on a particular vote.
6. An excused absence is neither counted for or against a legislator.
