Program Admission Requirements

Prior to applying for an Educational Leadership program, applicants must hold a Class I teaching license, should have at least three years teaching experience, and possess a 3.0 undergraduate GPA.

- 1. **GPA** calculation form: The form is provided during the application process. **NOTE:** We require a GPA of 3.00 for the last two (2) years of undergraduate course work.
- 2. Resume/Curriculum Vitae
- 3. Three (3) letters of recommendation via the Graduate School online College Net System:

At least one of the three recommendations must be from the candidate's **PRESENT** direct supervisor.

That means a school district administrator who (a) is currently administratively certified by Montana Office of Public Instruction or other equivalent state agency; AND (b) currently acts as direct supervisor for the candidate, and has done so for a minimum period of one semester; OR (c) from a PREVIOUS direct school district administrator who is (a) currently certified by the Montana Office of Public Instruction or other equivalent state agency.

Self-Nomination Letter: The self-nomination letter should be 2 pages, double-spaced, and focus on the following:

- 1. Your development and growth as a teacher, including professional development.
- 2. Your leadership contributions to your rural school/district.
- 3. Your specific goals and motivation to become a rural school leader.

Academic Transcripts: Official transcripts verifying all Bachelor's Degree course work should be sent to the Department of Education Graduate Programs Office, 215 Reid Hall, PO Box 172880, Montana State University, Bozeman, MT 59717.
