Although small and rural schools enroll only about 35% of all Montana public school students, they make up about 85% of all school districts in Montana. legislative action MREA always reports on what it means to Montana small and rural schools.

 Whether or not a rural school in Montana specifically enlists the legal services available through MREA membership, the MREA legal counsel has the experience with issues specific to rural schools to assist in guiding MREA in legal matters.

MREA represents only rural schools in the Legislative process

they can't. MREA has secured the services of an experienced professional lobbyist that will give us a far
greater political influence in the legislative process that often is driven by decisions made behind the
scenes.
